What is Pupil Premium funding?

Pupil Premium is additional funding to help schools close the attainment gap between children from low-income and other disadvantaged families and their peers. If a child has been eligible for free school meals (FSM) at any point, they attract funding for 6 years. If a child has been in local authority care for a day or more (LAC) the school receives an amount per head within their budget. Pupil Premium has risen each year to the current amount of £1,345 per pupil for those pupils who are or have been on FSM and £2,345 for LAC pupils. A provision of £310 is also made for children who have a parent in the armed services.

Bassingham Primary School is committed to ensuring maximum progress for all groups of children and strive to close any gaps. We have a clear, strategic approach to the use of specific Pupil Premium funding and plans are integrated into wider school support and improvement systems. These are monitored and evaluated regularly and in-depth data analysis ensures that the correct support and strategies are identified to maximise progress.

Strong leadership systems ensure that Pupil Premium funding has the necessary impact. This includes an identified governor having responsibility for Pupil Premium, the Headteacher leading the development plan and coordinated strategic leadership approach to implementing plans. All matters relating to Pupil Premium are reported back to Governors via the strategic committee, ensuring that the school is held to account for the impact of spending.

Key Priority

- To close the disadvantaged gap by addressing inequalities and raising the attainment of those students in low-income families.

What we expect to see:

Targeted additional support strategies that result in every student, however financially disadvantaged, being able to have full access to our curriculum and all our extra-curricular experiences. All students in the target group who are currently underperforming because of the impact of their disadvantaged background will make improved progress leading to the narrowing of any attainment gaps.

Future Funding Plans

- Training staff in the delivery of 1:1 conferencing, focusing on the following key areas:
 - Importance of quality pupil feedback
 - Power of teacher/pupil discussion
 - The key elements of Assessment for Learning
 - Importance of effective questioning
- Enrichment afternoon and wider/extra- curricular provision
 - Provide resources that enable staff to deliver quality enrichment opportunities
 - Allows school to invite specialist providers to deliver unique provision such as yoga, archery, martial arts etc.
 - Pupil Premium children to receive 'first choice' when accessing extra-curricular provision
 - Provide Pupil Premium children with a broad range of enrichment opportunities that will allow them to gain new experiences and skills beyond the classroom.



Tracking and Intervention

The progress and achievements of all pupils is monitored at key points in the academic year. Any pupils (disadvantaged or not) who are in need of intervention are identified and the necessary support is put in place. This is led by the Headteacher, SLT and SENCO through regular meetings and discussions. Scholar Pack is used to analyse assessment and to highlight differentials in performance and impact of interventions.
