**Remote Learning Update**

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Dear Parent/Carers,

Our approach to Remote Learning in response to the latest lockdown measures has been in place for almost two weeks now. With the majority of teething problems addressed, this approach seems to be supporting the learning of pupils at home. Thank you once again for your positive feedback, comments and continued support. We have reviewed this approach in school, listened to feedback received from parents and will be making some slight updates to the delivery of Remote Learning via Microsoft Teams. Please find the details below.

- Class teachers will continue to deliver the live lesson inputs at **9.00am, 11.00am and 1.00pm** each day.
- They will also continue to lead a review at the end of both morning lessons to discuss work completed, provide verbal feedback and to share answers.
- Once the live lesson inputs have been delivered, class teachers will then end the meeting taking place in Microsoft Teams. This will allow pupils time to work independently without any distractions and alongside their parents where required.
- Before the live lesson input ends, please encourage your child to ask any questions to ensure they fully understand the task that has been set by the class teacher.
- Work will always remain available in the 'files' folder for every lesson and can be accessed once the live lesson input has ended.
- There will no longer be a 'check out' at **3.00pm**. Once the afternoon work has been completed, please encourage your child to take their daily exercise or make use of one of our existing platforms such as Bug Club, Purple Mash, Times Tables Rock Stars or Education City.
- These changes will begin on **Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> January**.

The adjustments outlined above will ensure that your child can take regular breaks away from their device whilst being able to focus on their work with minimal distractions. It also aims to further promote independent learning. Your child's class teacher will explain the above changes in more detail during lessons in the morning. Each class teacher may take a slightly different approach towards the above changes but will inform you of these tomorrow.

If you experience any major issues during your child's independent learning time, please contact the school office or put a message in the 'posts' section of your child's class on Microsoft Teams. We hope that this update to our delivery of Remote Learning continues to provide all pupils with a robust education whilst learning from home.
