Outcomes

1. Teachers are more confident in delivering a wider range of Games lessons in particular with a greater emphasis upon coaching/teaching basic skills. Observed PE lessons have more consistent levels of activity with all pupils experiencing greater physical activity for longer amounts of time.
2. New archery and tag rugby equipment has improved our provision for extra-curricular opportunities in particular. This has been available to all our children in KS1 and KS2 during lunchtime breaks.
3. Our specialist website subscription provided access to detailed and progressive lesson plans and resources which enhanced our teaching and learning. Teachers made particular use of this to help teach areas of the curriculum they may have been unfamiliar with.
4. We have been enabled to participate in football, tag rugby, rounders and volleyball tournaments. We have also used the budget allocation to release staff to manage the children whilst at the tournaments and cover their absence from school as well.
5. Swimming – 100% of our current Year 6 class are able to confidently/proficiently swim at least 25m, 100% of our current Year 6 class can effectively use a range of strokes and 97% of our current Year 6 class can perform self-rescue procedures. We have previously used PE and Sport Premium to help subsidise the cost of our more able swimmers working beyond national curriculum requirements.
